FEDERAL STUDENT LOAN PROCESS

Summer 2010:

NEW STUDENT LOAN BORROWERS

For the Summer 2010, which is part of the 2009-2010 academic year, all new students requesting a loan will need to select a Lender and sign a Master Promissory note. You may use Union's lender list found at www.uu.edu/financialaid/loans. The Student Financial Planning Office must certify these loans by May 17, 2010, as lenders will not be accepting new applications for 2009-2010 after this date.

Students who request a Federal Stafford Loan, Federal PLUS Loan or a Federal Grad PLUS Loan for Summer 2010 must have all required documents on file in the Office of Student Financial Planning by May 17, 2010.

Students not meeting this deadline may not be awarded a Federal Loan and may need to consider a credit-based Private Alternative Loan to cover their expenses. A list of private loan lenders is available at www.uu.edu/financialaid/loans, or students may select a lender of their own choice.

All new students will also need to be accepted or admitted into their program of study by this date.

CONTINUING STUDENTS

Continuing students requesting additional loan funds for summer must complete a Summer Loan Request form by May 17 as well.

Students not meeting this deadline may not be awarded a Federal Loan and may need to consider a credit-based Private Alternative Loan to cover their expenses. A list of private loan lenders is available at www.uu.edu/financialaid/loans, or students may select a lender of their own choice.

Fall 2010:

On March 30, 2010, President Obama signed HR4872, the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act into law. Beginning July 1, 2010, all new Federal Loans will be issued through the U.S. Department of Education rather than private lenders. For 2010-11 Federal Loan procedures, you may find additional information at www.uu.edu/financialaid/loans/2010. The process is changing for all federal loans certified after July 1, 2010.
