- Weekly partner meetings to pray, plan, and prepare to lead your Life Group.

- Not dating within your Life Group during the fall semester.
- Writing a Life Group Leader covenant with your fellow leaders a covenant detailing your commitment to the Life Group community.
- Accountability to fellow Life Group Leaders, Support Team, and Directors.
- Maintaining a Union University required 2.5 GPA while a Life Group Leader.
- Attending the spring leadership training weekend, April 11-13, 2014.
- Attending the fall Life Group Leader Orientation, August 11-13, 2014, LGL Work Day, August 14 and New Student Orientation (Focus), August 15-17.
