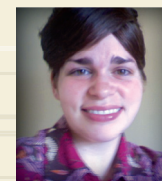

Andrea McDaniel, a 1999 Union University graduate and executive director of the As We Forgive-Rwanda Initiative, will be the keynote speaker at the Union Auxiliary luncheon Tuesday, October 12 at noon.

AWFRI is a non-profit organization that promotes post-genocide healing and reconciliation from an authentically Christian perspective. McDaniel has a passion for peace-building, economic development and strengthening the church, and those interests led her to begin the organization in 2009.

Prior to that role, McDaniel served for more than five years at the U.S. Department of State. There she established a federal office responsible for facilitating private sector participation in worldwide public diplomacy initiatives. Her work included spearheading the U.S.-Palestinian Partnership, a public-private partnership that supports peaceful solutions to conflict by promoting economic opportunities in Israel and Palestine.

She has also worked in the Executive Office of the President of the United States, where she personally advised George W. Bush on political appointments to government agencies.

Andrea is actively involved in the Church of the Resurrection in Washington, D.C., and enjoys good Southern cooking on regular visits to her Tennessee home in Henderson County.
