Prior to joining Union University as an Associate Professor of Pharmacy Practice and the Assistant Director of Experiential Education, Dr. Greene served as an Assistant Professor of Pharmacy and the Director of Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experience (IPPE) at Wingate University from 2005-2011. Prior to her faculty appointment at Wingate University, Dr. Greene opened and managed two community pharmacies in North Carolina, Moose Midland Pharmacy and Oakboro Pharmacy where she served as the pharmacist manager and coordinated clinical services (including diabetes clinics).

Ieremy Isbell




My name is Jeremy Isbell and I am a senior pursuing a degree in music with an emphasis in Christian Studies. I grew up in Jackson


