

Works on Paper Competitive Juried Art Exhibition

The Union University Department of Art and School of Theology and Missions announce a call to high school artists for a "Works on Paper" art exhibition March 9-11, 2017 to help celebrate the 500^{th} anniversary of the Reformation. The exhibit will be juried and cash prizes awarded (see below) and will be held in the Penick Academic Complex on the campus of Union University in Jackson, Tennessee.

Ten prizes will be awarded, including \$150.00 Best of Show with a \$1000.00 Tuition Scholarship Award; \$100.00 First Place with a \$500.00 Tuition Scholarship Award; \$75.00 Second Place with a \$250.00 Tuition Scholarship Award; \$50.00 Third Place and Four Honorable Mentions \$25.00 each.

Accepted artwork must revolve around positive aspects of the Reformation. The Reformation has had a huge impact on western culture in the last 500 years. Student artists might choose to explore the ways in which Reformation ideology, theology and history have influenced society and the visual metaphors that might best describe those influences.

Artwork submitted can be created using any medium, but must be on paper, unframed but appropriately matted for presentation and hanging. Matted work is not to exceed 48" X 48". Artists must be currently enrolled in high school or the home school equivalent of 10th through 12th grades. Each student may submit only one entry. **Artwork must be delivered to the Department of Art at Union University no later than 4:00, March 3rd**. Entries can be picked up at the conclusion of the exhibit, March 11 or the following week in the Department of Art, 8:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., M-F. The Department of Art at Union University reserves the right to refuse to hang inappropriate artwork or any work that does not reflect the theme of the exhibition.
