WHAT IS "YOU ARE HERE"? "You Are Here" is a suggested outline of various resources to help challenge, encourage, equip, and mobilize university students. This compilation of resources includes a variety of topics, formats, and perspectives that focus on God's Word, God's World, and God's Work.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE? Life often presents us with a different set of circumstances than we expect. Those unexpected realities, disruptions, and new circumstances can easily lead us to a place of uncertainty about what's next, complacency in our pursuits, apathy in our relationships, and fear about what lies ahead. Regardless of where we find ourselves in the current moment and regardless of what lies ahead, we have a choice: how are we going to steward what has been entrusted to us? Will we view our current reality as a season of waiting and uncertainty, something to simply get past, or will we will view it as an opportunity for preparation?

- Preparation for a future ministry opportunity
- Preparing your heart (through spiritual disciplines) to walk in faith and obedience as the Lord opens doors for next steps
- Preparing to mobilize others by praying for specific people in your circles of influence to join you in taking next steps
- Preparation for the fulfillment of God's purposes by praying for unreached people groups and for laborers to take the gospel.

Regardless of our location and season of life, it can be leveraged for God's purposes. If you are unable to go or send right now, is one of the reasons so that you can strategically be part of raising up others for the future?

WHO IS THIS FOR? This is for you. And your friends. This will be most effective if you do it with someone. Invite a friend (or a few!) to join you. Participating with others provides accountability and avenues for discussion as well as opportunities to hear how God is working in other people and in other places.

WHAT IS INCLUDED? Each week will include recommendations of things to read, listen to, and watch, a prayer guide, scripture memory, and activities. You will find stories of God's work in different places around the world and teaching on God's redemptive purposes from Genesis to Revelation and various topics. You will learn from people from different countries, cultures, and backgrounds, but with a shared purpose: making Christ known among the nations and building the kingdom of God. This is intended to engage your heart (what you love), your mind (what you think), and your hands (what you do).

HOW MUCH TIME IS INVOLVED? You can go at your own pace and participate at any level you wish. Each resource can be used independently. You will find a link to each resource as well as estimates on the time involved for the audio and video elements.
